# Welcome to the Spring 2026 Program Guidebook!

“Think of all the beauty still left around you and be happy.”

– Anne Frank, *The Diary of a Young Girl*

Anne Frank was exceptional in her ability to find beauty and courage while in hiding from the Nazis with her family in Amsterdam during WWII. Written with the candor and enthusiasm of a young teen, Frank’s diary juxtaposes the horrors of war with her unwavering belief in a bright future. Her words remain deeply relevant today.

The Bozeman Public Library will host *Anne Frank: A History for Today*, a traveling exhibit in our lobby gallery during March. This project is brought to us by the University of South Carolina’s Anne Frank Center, a partner of the Anne Frank House, the Anne Frank House, and the Institute for Holocaust Education. The free exhibit includes images from Frank’s childhood and excerpts from her diary, contextualized within the broader historical backdrop of the Holocaust.

We invite you to visit this exhibit during the Library’s open hours. You can learn more about Anne Frank through the Library collection. We have *A Diary of a Young Girl* in print, as well as audio and ebook formats on Hoopla. The classic 1987 BBC miniseries adaptation of the play is available on our Kanopy service. The Library also has many biographies and nonfiction books to help you learn more about the Frank family, the Holocaust, and the WWII period in general.

Your Library is a place of storytelling, community connection, and conversation. Anne Frank, between the ages of 13 and 15, documented her life in a chaotic and terrifying world with the skill of a master storyteller. Please join us in March as we remember her contribution to the world.

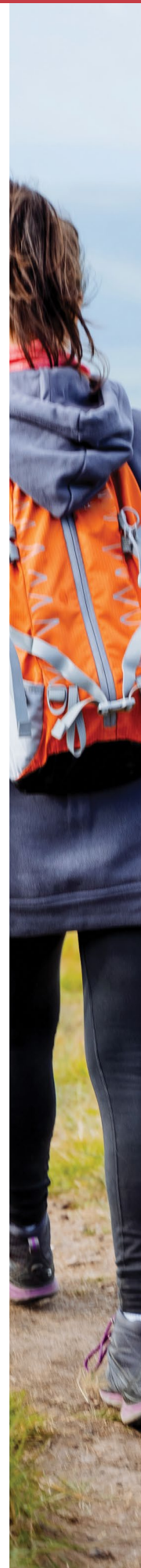

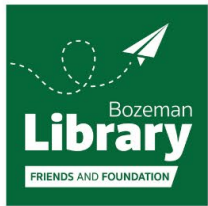

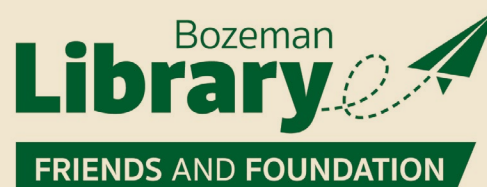
